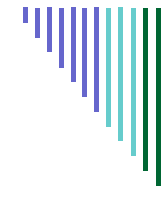

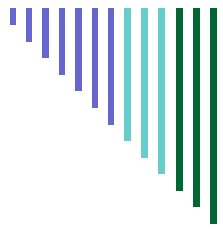

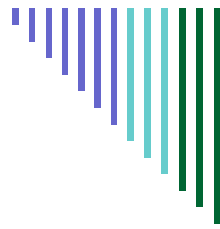


Art of Advocacy

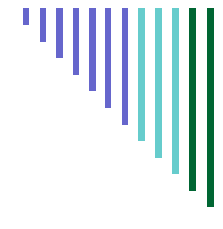


Be Educated
